## GROWING NATIVE TREES AND SHRUBS

### Small scale and garden growing

Because a plant is a native does not mean it will automatically grow in any particular conditions. There is a world of difference between the rainforest gullies of the Otways and the clay pan / sand dunes of the Mallee plains.

Therefore it is important to choose the plant that not only possesses the form and function you require, but also suits the conditions that you can provide.

Having said that however, they are better adapted to Australian generalities (such as low phosphorous soil) than exotics, and of course are more in sympathy with our birds and other wildlife. There is also a great range of flower, foliage and bark, so that there are plants for many effects.

Pruning and watering vary with species, as do positioning and soil type suitability. There is some information in the notes on each species to refer to. In general, little or no feeding is necessary, but if it is required then just use a little blood and bone or slow release fertilizer specifically for Australian natives, as they do not like as much phosphorous as exotics. In particular, Grevillea, Hakea and Banksia are very sensitive to it.

### Tubed stock

- The trees are in root trainer tubes, 12.5cm x 5.0cm square. These are high quality containers that encourage healthy root growth.
- Water tubes well the night before planting.
- It is necessary to remove the tube before planting. *Take care not to disturb the roots or loosen the earth.*
- Firm the soil around the newly planted tree to eliminate air pockets. After firming, the tree should be upright and the level of the tube at approximately the same level as the surrounding ground.
- Water in well.



## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### Height

Height shown is based on growth in the drier areas and is a general guide only. Mature heights vary according to climate and soil conditions.

### Rainfall

Many plants listed will grow in areas outside their normal range if planted in a suitable location or grown under garden conditions.

### Soils

These have been classified as follows:

- A. Alkaline sandy loams typical of upper Wimmera and Mallee supporting pine and buloke.
- B. Alkaline sands with lime content in subsoil usually supporting Mallee eucalypt vegetation.
- C. Sandy clay loams or clay loams, low lying ground liable to temporary water-logging.
- D. Red Wimmera clay loams - typical Wimmera soils.
- E. Black Wimmera clay soils.
- F. Clay loams containing iron-stone gravel, usually neutral or acid, eg. Southern Wimmera soils.
- G. Sands, sandy loams generally neutral or acid, eg. Grampians soils.



## ACACIAS

### Acacia acinacea - GOLD DUST WATTLE

1-2m x 2m. This species is an excellent garden plant for warm dry areas. Masses of flowers from August to November on slender branches.

Minimum rainfall 350mm. Soils D.E.F.G.

### Acacia baileyana - COOTAMUNDRA WATTLE

5-8m x 5-8m. A hardy species with attractive foliage and flowers. A winter variety with spreading crown and feathery glaucous leaves. Suitable for low windbreak and ornamental planting in parks and gardens.

Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.F.G.

### Acacia baileyana ssp.- COOTAMUNDRA WATTLE Purpurea

5-8m x 5-8m. A hardy species with attractive purple foliage. A winter flowering variety with spreading crown and feathery glaucous leaves. Suitable for low windbreak and ornamental planting in parks and gardens.

Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.F.G.

### Acacia boormanii - SNOWY RIVER WATTLE

3-4m x 2-3m. Slender shrub fast growing and hardy with a mass of golden ball flowers July to October. Tolerates frost, wetness and most soils if well drained.

### Acacia brachybotrya - GREY MULGA

2-3m x 2-3m. A good windbreak, it is a dense and spreading ornamental shrub from North Western Victoria. It has masses of flowers from August to October.

Minimum rainfall 250mm. Soils A.D.F.G.

### Acacia dealbata - SILVER WATTLE

8m x 4m. Occurring naturally in Victoria, this medium tree tolerates wetness, frost and snow, but is drought tender. Bright yellow perfumed flowers in spring. Grey, fern-like foliage.

### Acacia drummondii ssp Elegans - DRUMMOND'S WATTLE

1-3m x 2-3m. Flowers from July to October. The flowers appear like golden rods.

Foliage is greenish-bluish grey and feather-like. Usually drought and frost resistant.

### Acacia elata - CEDAR WATTLE

30m x 9m. Tall tree with large pale creamy/yellow fluffy ball like flowers occurring in loose clusters in summer. Will grow in most soils. Tolerates wetness, drought and frost tender when young.

### Acacia floribunda - CATKIN WATTLE

5m x 5m. A small attractive tree with deep yellow flowers. Suitable for planting in conjunction with a high-growing tree as a windbreak. Useful for coastal planting and poorly drained sites.

Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.E.F.



**Acacia genistifolia - SPREADING WATTLE (Syn. A. Diffusa)**

Loose, irregular shrub from 1.5m to 2m. Flowerheads usually pale yellow, Aug-Oct. Found over most of Victoria, common on heathland and hillside.

**Acacia glaucoptera - CLAY BUSH WATTLE**

1.5m x 2.5m. An attractive ornamental dense winged foliaged shrub with red new growth. Yellow ball flowers along the stem during spring. Most soils. Drought and frost tolerant. Also lime tolerant.

**Acacia genistifolia - SPREADING WATTLE**

2m x 2m. Narrow sharply pointed leaves, pale yellow flowers in clusters during the winter. Tolerates dryness and some frost. Most soils.

**Acacia howittii - STICKY WATTLE**

5-8m. A shapely, small tree having dark green foliage and weeping branches. Fast growing. Prefers moist conditions. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.F.G.

**Acacia implexa - LIGHTWOOD or HICKORY WATTLE**

Up to 12m. Very similar to Blackwood, with pale flowers in summer. Handles more sun than Blackwood. Good erosion controller on banks.

**Acacia iteaphylla - GAWLER RANGE WATTLE**

3m x 3m. An attractive, fast growing, small, bushy shrub, suitable for low shelter. Minimum rainfall 300mm. Most soil types.

**Acacia ligulata - UMBRELLA BUSH or COOBA WATTLE**

4m x 3m. A small tree with an erect, slender and graceful stem and weeping branches. The flowers are golden balls appearing in spring and summer. Tolerates drought, lime and salty soils. Usually frost resistant.

**Acacia mearnsii - BLACK WATTLE**

16m x 4m. Creamy yellow flowers appearing spring to summer. Tolerates dryness and lime. Is adaptable to most soils and positions. Usually frost resistant. Can be used as a quick growing shelter tree.

**Acacia melanoxylon - BLACKWOOD**

16m x 7m. A tall attractive wattle with deep green foliage and cream flowers from July to Oct. A very long-lived wattle giving a very high quality timber with age. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.F.G.

**Acacia myrtifolia - MYRTLE WATTLE**

2m x 2m. A small shrub often reddish stems, common in the Wimmera. Good garden shrub with large creamy yellow flowers in Spring. Tolerates dryness, lime and frost. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils - most types.

**Acacia paradoxa (armata) - KANGAROO THORN or HEDGE WATTLE**

3m x 4m. Indigenous to mainland Australia. A very prickly shrub which affords protection to small birds during nesting season. Gold ball flowers in spring. Tolerates dryness, lime and coastal exposure.



*Acacia pendula* - WEEPING MYALL

7-10m x 6-8m. A small to medium shrub with slender pendulous branches. Withstands drought conditions on a wide variety of soils.

Minimum rainfall 300mm. Soils C.D.E.F.

*Acacia podalyriaefolia* - MOUNT MORGAN WATTLE or QUEENSLAND SILVER WATTLE

3m x 5m. Tall shrub with erect, slender stem. Smooth, pale bark and graceful weeping habit. Silver-grey foliage with profuse bright yellow flowers in winter and early spring. Tolerates dryness, usually frost resistant.

*Acacia pravissima* - OVENS WATTLE

6m x 3m. Small tree with graceful drooping habit. Small yellow ball flowers in profuse clusters appearing in spring and summer. Tolerates dryness, lime, frost, snow, smog and some coastal exposure.

*Acacia pycnantha* - GOLDEN WATTLE

3m x 2m. This tree is well known in Victoria. It has masses of fragrant flowers from August to October. The bark is rich in tannin. A very hardy wood lot tree. Minimum rainfall 350mm. Soils A.B.D.F.

*Acacia retinoides* - "WIRILDA"

3-7m. A hardy tree suitable for low windbreaks, shade and ornamental plantings. Flowers for long periods each year. Minimum rainfall 300mm. Soils D.F.G.

*Acacia saligna* - GOLDEN WREATH WATTLE

5m x 4m. A very attractive small tree with large golden flower balls in spring and greyish foliage on pendulous branches. Good for windbreaks and erosion control. Tolerates dryness, lime, salty soils and some frost. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils - most soils.

*Acacia stricta* - HOP WATTLE

1-5m x 2-4m. A hardy small tree with narrow leaves, small clusters of pale yellow flowers in winter. Will grow in most soils. Tolerates dryness and frost.

*Acacia verniciflua* - VARNISH WATTLE

4m x 3m. Tall shrub with handsome foliage. The flowers are deep yellow balls appearing in spring. Tolerates wetness, dryness, lime, smog and frost.

*Acacia vestita* - HAIRY WATTLE

4m x 2m. Tall shrub with soft grey-green foliage. The flowers are deep yellow balls appearing in spring. Tolerates wetness, dryness, lime, smog and frost.

## SHE OAKS / BULL OAKS

*Allocasuarina luehmannii* - BULL-OAK

9-15m. A good firewood tree which grows relatively quickly on moderately good sites. Tolerates heavy frosts and a wide range of soils.

Minimum rainfall 350mm. Soils - most types



*Allocasuarina muellerana* - SLATY SHE-OAK

4m. Medium to tall shrub with grey-green foliage, which is sometimes red. Useful for warm to hot areas. Tolerates drought and lime. Usually frost resistant.

*Allocasuarina torulosa* - ROSE SHE-OAK

18m x 18m. A good windbreak or ornamental tree. Forms a neat pyramidal shape. Minimum rainfall 550mm. Soils F.G.

*Allocasuarina verticillata* - DROOPING SHE-OAK

10m.x.5m. (Formerly “*Casuarina stricta*) A handsome tree with straight trunk and drooping foliage. Suitable for windbreaks. Withstands coastal exposure. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils A.C.D.E.F.

*Casuarina cunninghamiana* - RIVER SHE-OAK

20-35m x 1-1.5m. Tall dense tree good for windbreak. Shade and ornamental planting. Can be used for low grade fodder. Excellent fuel and timber. Tolerates flooding, drought, frost, lime and salt, though *glauca* is better for salt. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils A.C.D.E.F.

## KANGAROO PAWS

*Anigozanthus flavidus* - KANGAROO PAW

1m x 1m. Vigorous plant with yellow/green flower spikes in Summer. Prefers full sun and likes well drained soils

*Anigozanthus manglesii* - COMMON KANGAROO PAW

Tall spikes of red and green flowers in Spring. Prefers full sun and well-drained soils.

## BANKSIA

*Banksia marginata* - SILVER BANKSIA

4-7m x 2-3m. Found in many parts of Victoria. Has leaves which are silvery underneath and spikes of yellow flowers in Sept. - April. Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils F.G.

*Banksia victoriae* - WOOLLY ORANGE

2-7 M HIGH. Non lignotuberous shrub or tree. Flowers are orange yellow and occur in Jan to Feb. Most soil types which need to be well drained and tolerates full sun to part shade. Tolerates moderate frosts. Excellent for attracting birds.

## BOTTLEBRUSHES

*Callistemon citrinus* - CRIMSON BOTTLE-BRUSH

4m. A small shrub with showy crimson flowers. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils F.G.

*Callistemon* - KING PARK SPECIAL

3-5 m x 3-4 m. Elegant spreading tree with red bottlebrush flowers most prolific in the spring. Full sun to part shade, adaptable to most soils. Fast growing and tolerates long dry periods. Bird attracting, and suitable for small yards and screening.



**Callistemon - MARY MCKILLOP**

2m x 1.5 m with upright habit. Ends of branches weeping but not pendulous. This plant do better with good watering and mulching. Red flowers are produced in spring and summer and the plant provides seeds and nectar for birds.

**Callistemon - RUGULOSUS**

4 m in height with stiff, sharply pointed leaves. The flower spikes are 5-5cm in diameter and occur mid-spring to late summer. The stamens are rosy red with yellow anthers imparting a golden speckled appearance.

**Callistemon macropunctatis - SCARLET BOTTLE-BRUSH**

4m x 4m. Gold tipped red flowers and drooping branches. Minimal rainfall 450. Tolerates all soil conditions.

**Callistemon pallidus - LEMON BOTTLE-BRUSH**

4m. A small upright tree with pale-green leaves and yellow flowers. Minimum rainfall 650mm. Soils A.D.E.F.G.

**Callistemon phoeniceus - FIERY BOTTLE-BRUSH**

3m. The rich, red flowers are a striking contrast to the greyish leaves. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils A.D.E.F.G.

**Callistemon rigidus - STIFF BOTTLE-BRUSH**

2m x 2m. This shrub has long narrow leaves and deep red flowers in Spring and Summer. Adapts to a wide range of conditions and will handle wetness. Usually frost resistant.

**Callistemon salignus - WILLOW BOTTLE-BRUSH**

7m. Large shrub or small tree. Attractive specimen with new foliage being bright pink. Cream to lemon flowers in late Spring and sometimes Autumn. Will accept wet or dry soils and is moderately frost hardy.

**Callistemon speciosus - SHOWY BOTTLEBRUSH**

3m x 2m. Medium to tall shrub with distinctive foliage and large red bottlebrush flowers in spring and summer. Adaptable to most soils. Tolerates wetness and lime. Usually frost resistant.

**Callistemon sieberi - RIVER BOTTLEBRUSH**

Shrub or small tree with leaves that are 20 - 50 mm long with pointed tips. Cream, pale yellow or pink flowers spikes are mostly produced between November and January. Tolerates a large range of soil conditions.

**Callistemon pinifolius - PINE LEAVED BOTTLEBRUSH**

1m x 1m. Leaves are 4 to 8 cm long and have sharply pointed tips. The flower spikes are yellowish green or red with slightly darker anthers. Will tolerate all soil conditions and usually frost resistant.

**Callistemon viminalis - WEEPING RED BOTTLE-BRUSH**

6-8m x 4m. Beautiful tall shrub with masses of deep red flowers in Spring. Very adaptable to most soils and conditions, but frost tender when young.



**Callistemon violaceus - VIOLET BOTTLE-BRUSH**

3m x 3m. Medium to tall shrub with red purplish violet flowers in Spring. Usually frost resistant. Soils most types.

## GUMS

**Eucalyptus alpina - GRAMPIANS GUM**

3.5m x 3m. A very hardy, spreading small tree with broad leathery, shiny leaves. It is frost hardy, tolerates dry conditions and can withstand strong winds. Has white flowers from Jan to Feb.

Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils F.G.

**Eucalyptus albida - WHITE LEAVED MALLEE**

3m x 2m. Attractive medium to tall shrub with light green-grey leaves. Flowers are white. Drought and frost resistant.

**Eucalyptus aromaphloia - SCENT BARK**

Medium to large shrub. Coarse brown bark, aromatic when handled. Good shade and shelter, tolerates wet periods and moderate frost.

Prefers moist acid soils.

**Eucalyptus astringens - BROWN MALLEE**

12m x 18m. A smooth barked, medium tree suitable for windbreaks and woodlots.

Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils D.E.F.

**Eucalyptus baxterii - BROWN STRINGYBARK**

15m - 40m. Medium to tall tree, but adopts a Mallee habit on dry sites. Late Summer white flowers, brown fibrous bark. Fairly durable hard timber. Good fuel. Tolerates dryness and some frost. Grows on a wide variety of soils and sites.

**Eucalyptus botryoides - MAHOGANY GUM**

12-20m. A good shade and shelter tree with a large spreading crown. Can be grown in irrigation areas. Thrives under reasonably moist conditions.

Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils D.E.F.

**Eucalyptus caesia - GUNGURRU (Silver Princess)**

4-8m x 3-6m. A small tree with silver and red branches, beautiful peeling bark and large, gold-tipped pink flowers. Thrives on gravelly soils.

Minimum rainfall 350-500mm. Soils D.E.F.

**Eucalyptus camaldulensis - RED RIVER GUM**

20m x 25m. Tall spreading tree. Suitable for shade, shelter, farm, forests and honey production. Suitable for a wide range of conditions, including excessively wet areas, very dry areas along stream banks and areas subject to flooding. Growth is rapid when young. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils C.F.

**Eucalyptus campaspe - SILVER TOP GIMLET**

10m x 8 m. Evergreen tree that tolerates dry for long extended periods of time. Features bronze-red brown smooth bark with blue grey leaves. Cream flowers in the early spring to late summer. Average growth rate. Tolerates all weather conditions. Bird and bee attracting.



*Eucalyptus cinerea* - ARGYLE APPLE

10m x 4m. Small to medium tree with blue-grey foliage and creamy to yellowish flowers late spring. Adaptable to most soils. Tolerates dryness, lime and smog. Usually frost resistant. An ornamental tree which can be used for shade.

*Eucalyptus citriodora* - LEMON SCENTED GUM

12-20m x 9-15m. A handsome, ornamental tree with smooth, chalky white - pinkish bark and canopy of strongly lemon scented leaves. Good timber and fuel. Frost tender when young. Tolerates lime and dryness.

Minimum rainfall 400mm.

*Eucalyptus cladocalyx* - SUGAR GUM

20-25m x 10-15m. Tall tree with spreading crown and white flowers in Summer. Good for shelter and shade. Excellent fuel and timber. Tolerates drought and lime. Likes well drained soils. Frost tender when young.

Minimum rainfall 400mm.

*Eucalyptus cladocalyx* "nana" - DWARF SUGAR GUM

5-7m x 5-7m. Smaller version than the Sugar Gum. Tolerates saltier soil and is more frost resistant. Very good windbreak and fuel. Minimum rainfall 400mm.

*Eucalyptus conferruminata* - BUSHY YATE

15-25m and width variable. Small tree or mallee with smooth grey and whitish grey bark. Adult leaves are glossy light green. Yellow - green flowers appear from late winter to late spring. Excellent windbreak and useful wind erosion control tree. Ornamental large bushy tree that is suitable for most soils.

*Eucalyptus cosmophylla* - CUP GUM

3-10m x 3-10m. An ornamental tree which tolerates infertile, poorly drained soils. It has smooth coloured bark, a dense crown and profuse white flowers in Autumn and Winter. Large cream to pink buds. Tolerates lime and frost.

Minimum rainfall 650mm.

*Eucalyptus crenulata* - SILVER GUM

Small to medium tree with roundish silvery foliage and white flowers in Spring. The foliage of this tree is very ornamental. Prefers cooler moister conditions. Tolerates frost.

*Eucalyptus diversifolia* - SOAP MALLEE

5m with slaty smooth bark. Grows in all soil conditions and is tolerant of frosts. Highly perfumed, heavily laden, cream flowers in the spring.

*Eucalyptus eremophila* - TALL SAND MALLEE

7m x 7m. Good ornamental or windbreak for well drained semi-arid areas, decorative new bark, large buds and masses of yellow or pink flowers, June to Sept. Lime, salt, and drought tolerant. Grows in most soils.

Minimum rainfall 250mm.



**Eucalyptus ficifolia - WEST AUSTRALIAN RED FLOWERING GUM**

7-8m. Useful for shade and ornamental planting in gardens, parks and avenues. Showy masses of flowers vary in shade from pink to deep crimson. Frost tender when young. Prefers moist well-drained sandy soils.  
Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils F.G.

**Eucalyptus foecunda - SLENDER LEAF MALLEE**

Slender Grey leaves and compact habit. Abundance of cream flowers in Summer. Usually frost resistant, tolerates drought and lime. Good windbreak. Prefers well drained soils.

**Eucalyptus forrestiana - FUCHSIA GUM**

3-4m. A small, bushy tree with attractive, pendulous capsules which are bright red at flowering time. Suitable for shelter, ornamental or street planting  
Minimum rainfall 350mm. Soils A.D.E.F.

**Eucalyptus gardeneri - BLUE MALLEE**

9m x 8m. A medium shelter tree with bluish foliage retained close to the ground and profuse, light yellow flowers. A useful tree for semi-arid conditions.  
Minimum rainfall 300mm. Soils D.E.F.G.

**Eucalyptus globulus ssp bicostata - VICTORIAN BLUE GUM**

12m x 4m. Stately medium to tall tree. Can be used for ornamental and shelter purposes. Cool moist sites. Will withstand considerable wetness. Tolerates light snow, frost and smog.

**Eucalyptus globulus "compacta" - BUSHY BLUE GUM**

5-6m x 4-5m. Smaller form of blue gum. Young trees have a short trunk with a bushy crown. Can assume tree form as they age.  
Minimum rainfall 650mm. Soils F.G.

**Eucalyptus gonicalyx -LONG-LEAVED BOX or OLIVE BARKED BOX**

10-15 m high. This tree has rough and persistent bark to the small branches. It is fibrous, greyish, becoming deeply fissured, thick and shaggy in the large trees. White flowers in the early autumn to mid-winter.

**Eucalyptus gomphocephala - TUART**

7-10m x 5-7m. Rough grey bark and cream flowers with strong, durable timber, also good for windbreaks. Tolerates drought, lime and light frost. Needs well-drained soils.  
Minimum rainfall 500mm.

**Eucalyptus grandis - FLOODED GUM**

20-30m x 10-15m. A large timber and shelter tree. Fast growing and suited to wet sites and irrigation areas in Northern Victoria.  
Minimum rainfall 650mm. Soils F.G.

**Eucalyptus grossa - PHILLIPS RIVER GUM**

4m x 4m. Medium to tall ornamental shrub. Large glossy thick leaves and profuse large yellow flowers in Spring. Tolerates dryness, lime and salt. Needs well drained soils and is frost tender when young.  
Minimum rainfall 250mm.



*Eucalyptus incrassata* - YELLOW MALLEE

5m x 5m. Common in North West Victoria. Bushy with attractive buds and fruit. Cream flowers, a good honey tree. Tolerates drought, salt, lime and frost. Needs well drained soil.

Minimum rainfall 250mm.

*Eucalyptus kitsoniana* - GIPPSLAND MALLEE

2-7m. A small upright, compact tree when grown in well-drained soil. In wet soils it may be shrubby or of Mallee habit.

Minimum rainfall 600mm. Soils C.D.E.F.G.

*Eucalyptus kruseana* - KRUSE'S MALLEE

3m x 3m. Bluish grey foliage, greenish yellow flowers in Autumn and Winter, and powdery white buds of fruit. Ornamental. Tolerates drought, lime and some frost. Needs well drained soil.

*Eucalyptus largiflorens* - BLACK BOX

10-15m x 12m. A spreading, shapely and hardy tree with rugged grey bark and dull, green grey leaves. Bears small cream flowers from Aug. to Dec. Its timber is very durable and suitable for posts.

Minimum rainfall 250mm. Soils C.D.E.

*Eucalyptus Lehmannii* - BUSHY YATE

7m high Bark smooth, light pink to grey brown or red, often with accumulated older bark at base of trunk. Flowers are cream/green/yellow in Jan to March or July or September. Tolerates all soil conditions and is advised for hills, exposed areas and along creek beds.

*Eucalyptus leucoxylon* - YELLOW GUM

14-20m x 8-15m. White flowers and white mottled bark. A graceful ornamental tree with durable timber for posts etc. Frost hardy and adaptable to a wide variety of soils. Minimum rainfall 500mm.

*Eucalyptus leucoxylon* ssp. *megalocarpa* - YELLOW GUM (pink)

4-8m x 4-8m. A pink or red flowering form of yellow gum. It has large fruits and leaves and is often multi-stemmed. Useful windbreak. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.E.F.G.

*Eucalyptus leucoxylon* ssp. *rosea* - YELLOW GUM (pink/red)

4-8-m x 4-8m. A small to medium short-trunked tree with spreading branches and red flowers. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils D.E.F.G.

*Eucalyptus loxophleba* - YORK GUM

8-10m x 6-8m. A drought and frost resistant species that has proved to be tolerant of salty soils. A good tree for shade or shelter in shallow soils. Minimum rainfall 300mm. Soils D.E.F.G.

*Eucalyptus macrocarpa* - MOTTLECAH

1-5 M HIGH. Bark smooth, grey over salmon pink. Flowers are red-pink in Aug. to Dec. or Jan or April to June. White or grey sand or sandy loam. Great for hillsides, ridges and sandplains.



*Eucalyptus macrorhyncha* - RED STRINGYBARK

12m x 30m. Medium to tall tree with coarse stringy bark and quite good timber and fuel. Grows in a variety of soils, mainly those of moderate fertility and clayey nature, though well drained.

*Eucalyptus maculata* - SPOTTED GUM

15-20m x 10-15m. Tall ornamental tree with white bark dappled with bluish splotches. Tolerates most soils, has good timber and is good for fuel. Frost tender when young. Soils D.E.F.G.

*Eucalyptus melliodora* - YELLOW BOX

15m-20m. Prized as a honey tree. Has a dense spreading crown of somewhat drooping habit. Suitable for windbreaks, shade and specimen planting. Slow growing. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils C.F.

*Eucalyptus microcarpa* - GREY BOX

12-20m. Grown as a shade tree, for timber production and as windbreaks. Can be slow growing. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils C.D.E.

*Eucalyptus nicholli* -WILLOW LEAFED PEPPERMINT

7-15m x 3-10m. Ornamental medium tree of graceful form, narrow leaves and small white flowers. Tolerates dryness, lime and frost. Needs reasonably well drained soil. Minimum rainfall 650mm.

*Eucalyptus occidentalis* - SWAMP YATE

15-20m. Most useful for planting on poorly drained sites. Tolerates dryness, wetness, salt, lime and some frost. Yellow flowers. Shade, shelter, good timber and fire retarder.

*Eucalyptus oleosa* - ACORN MALLEE

3-10m x 3-8m. A small tree or Mallee with a smooth, grey bark and glossy leaves. Tolerates saline conditions. Minimum rainfall 250-450mm. Soils A.B.

*Eucalyptus ovata* - SWAMP GUM

12-20m x 10-15m. Rough bark at the base and smooth greyish bark above. Very good for wet sites and poorly drained soils in cooler areas. Masses of white flowers in Autumn attract birds. Minimum rainfall 600mm.

*Eucalyptus platypus* MOORT or ROUND LEAVED MOORT

1.5 - 10 M HIGH. Canopy of the tree is high and dense. Bark is smooth and light brown, aging to grey. A distinctive feature of this species are its elongated flat peduncles, which are about 3 cm long and 1 cm wide. Greenish-yellow or occasionally white, cream or rarely red flowers in the spring and summer, they can be difficult to see through the dense foliage. Suitable for all soil conditions.

*Eucalyptus polyanthemos* - RED BOX

10-15m. Produces a valuable, durable timber and is a good shade tree. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.F.G.



**Eucalyptus polybractea - BLUE MALLEE**

6m x 3m. Small to medium tree suitable for windbreak or shelter on clay, gravelly or sandy soils. Leaves are bluish-green and the flowers are white, appearing from autumn to winter. Tolerates drought, usually frost resistant.

**Eucalyptus radiata - NARROW-LEAVED PEPPERMINT**

30m high. Persistent bark on the trunk and larger branches or persistent to smaller branches. The bark shortly fibrous grey to grey brown shredding in long ribbons. Summer flowers are cream yellow. Suitable for most conditions.

**Eucalyptus robusta - SWAMP MAHOGANY**

Medium to tall tree with rough bark, glossy foliage and white flowers in Spring. Good for wet soils. Tolerates lime and frost.

**Eucalyptus rhodantha - ROSE MALLEE**

3m x 4m. Very striking ornamental with yellow tipped red flowers in Spring and Autumn, and large powdery grey leaves. Tolerates dryness and lime but frost tender when young. Likes well drained soils.

**Eucalyptus rubida - CANDLEBARK GUM - RIBBON GUM - WHITE GUM**

12-20m high. Has open crown and is recognized by the tall tree habit and smooth white bark, often with red to red brown old patches. The wood is tough and great for fencing. Flowers are small and in clusters of 3, white in color and open in late summer followed by cup-shaped seed capsules. Fast growing and is great for poor soil areas. Loves all weather conditions.

**Eucalyptus saligna - SYDNEY BLUE GUM**

Tall straight tree, with smooth bluish white bark and white flowers in Summer.

**Eucalyptus salmonophloia - SALMON GUM**

15m. A most attractive tree with a smooth trunk, salmon coloured in late Summer. A good shade or wood-lot tree.

Minimum rainfall 300mm. Soils A.B.C.D.E.

**Eucalyptus sargentii - SARGENT GUM**

7m. A small, bushy tree suitable for shelter. Moderately salt tolerant and useful for planting in saline soils. Minimum rainfall 300mm. Soils A.B.D.E.F.G.

**Eucalyptus sideroxylon - IRONBARK**

20m. x 12-15m. White to pink flowers. Striking furrowed dark trunk and grey blue leaves. Handsome and tough, drought, salt and lime tolerant with tough durable timber which is also good fuel.

Minimum rainfall 500mm. Tolerates most soils.

**Eucalyptus sideroxylon var. rosea - RED FLOWERING IRONBARK**

15-20m. A red flowering form of red ironbark suitable for ornamental planting.

Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils D.F.G.

**Eucalyptus scoparia - WALLANGARRA WHITE GUM**

Medium to tall willow like tree with narrow leaves and white flowers in Spring.

Tolerates drought, lime and frost. Soils - well drained soils.



*Eucalyptus spathulata* - SWAMP MALLET

7m. Has very narrow leaves and smooth reddish-brown bark. Suitable for wet sites. If open grown, develops a bushy crown.  
Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils C.D.E.F.

*Eucalyptus tetraptera* - SQUARE FRUITED MALLEE

4m x 5m. A tall ornamental shrub with thick leathery leaves and large red flowers in Spring and very large quadrangular scarlet buds. Frost tender when young. Tolerates dryness and lime. Prefers well drained soils.  
Minimum rainfall 450mm.

*Eucalyptus torquata* - CORAL GUM

Likes well drained soil and a warm position. Windbreak and ornamental with striking buds and white to deep pink flowers. Tolerates drought, lime and salt, can be frost tender when young.  
Minimum rainfall 250mm.

*Eucalyptus viridis* - GREEN MALLEE

Up to 10 m high. Bark persistent on lower trunk. Grey to dark grey, fibrous flaky, smooth above. Shredding occurs in short ribbons. Open habit allowing smaller shrubs to be grown under it. Frost hardy and good in sunny areas.

*Eucalyptus viminalis* - MANNA GUM

15-25m x 8-12m. A handsome tall tree with an open spreading crown and smooth bark shedding in ribbons. (It is sometimes called RIBBON GUM) Does best in moist areas, 65-mm or more annual rainfall and likes well drained soils. It is a hardy tree and is an important food source for Koalas.  
Soils F.G.

*Eucalyptus woodwardii* - LEMON FLOWERING GUM

10m x 5m. Medium tree with pendulous branches, greyish leaves, silver branchlets and buds, striking large clusters of lemon yellow flowers in Spring. Likes well drained soil, but tolerates lime, salt and some frost.  
Minimum rainfall 250mm.

## HAKEAS

*Hakea coriacea* - PINK SPIKE HAKEA

5-6m. Long, deep red to pink flower spikes in Winter. Compact with long narrow leaves. Likes good drainage and an open, sunny position. Will tolerate some frost.

*Hakea francisina* - GRASS LEAF HAKEA

4m x 3m. Has linear leaves up to 150 mm long. The red or reddish purple flower occur in large racemes up to about 100mm long, which occur in winter and spring. Will tolerate all soil conditions.



**Hakea laurina - PINCUSHION HAKEA**

5m x 4m. Decorative small tree with compact crown of narrow elliptical leaves and globular heads of cream tipped crimson flowers May - Aug. Minimum rainfall 350mm. Soils A.D.E.F.G.

**Hakea mutilineata - PINK BOTTLEBRUSH HAKEA**

3m x 2m. Compact shrub with long narrow leaves and dense bright pink flowers June - Nov. Severe frost can damage seedlings. Minimum rainfall 250mm. Soils A.D.F.G.

**Hakea nodosa -YELLOW HAKEA**

3m x 3m. Erect in habit. Its needle like leaves are usually between 40 and 50 mm in length. It has small cream to yellow flowers, clustered along its branches between late autumn and late winter. Yellow hakea is adaptable to a wide range of soils and climatic conditions and will grow well in full sun or part shade.

**Hakea petiolaris - SEA-URCHIN HAKEA**

4m x 3m. A compact shrub with thick, broad, greyish leaves and globular heads of white tipped, purplish-red flowers.

Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils A.B.F.G.

**Hakea sericea - BUSHY NEEDLEWOOD**

Medium to tall shrub with fine needle foliage and masses of lacy white flowers in Winter and Spring. Tolerates dryness, lime and frost.

Soils - most types.

## **HARDENBERGIAS**

**Hardenbergia violacea - SARSPARILLA**

2m x 4m. A small shrub or climber with attractive purple flowers from July - Oct. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils D.E.F.G.

## **GREVILLIA**

**Grevillia - APRICOT GLOW GREVILLIA** Error! Bookmark not defined.

1-2m high. Small shrub has oval foliage. Apricot spider flower heads occur in winter / spring. Grows in a moist well drained soil in full sun. Pruning maintains denseness and shape.

**Grevillia hookeriana - ROBIN HOOD GREVILLIA**

3M X 2 M. Large upright shrub with glossy green lobed leaves. Most of the year it has large red flowers on the tips of the branches. Attracts birds and insects. Prune after flowering for the best shape. Prefers a sunny site with well-drained soil, avoid heavy frosts.

**Grevillia obtusifolia - OBTUSE-LEAVED GREVILLIA**

0.5 and 1.5 metres in height and up to 5m in width. It produces pink to red flowers between August and November. Most soil conditions suit



**Grevillia robusta - SOUTHERN SILKY OAK or AUSTRALIAN SILVER OAK**

18-35m high. It is the largest plant in the grevillia genus, the trunk can reach in excess of 1 m. Its flowers are golden orange bottlebrush like blooms which occur in the spring. Suits all soil conditions.

**Grevillia rosmarinifolia - ROSEMARY GREVILLIA**

Is a well-known species which usually occurs as a small to medium rounded shrub up to 0.32m high. The flowers occur in clusters from the ends of the branches and are mainly red or pink, often with cream. Flowering occurs from winter through to spring and occasionally at other times. Tolerant of most soil conditions and prefers an open sunny well drained position. Prune regularly to maintain shape.

## **KUNZEAS**

**Kunzea ambigua - WHITE KUNZEA**

3m x 2m. This very hardy Kunzea has fine foliage and lemon scented flowers from Oct. - Nov. Minimum rainfall 600mm. Soils F.G.

**Kunzea baxterii - BAXTER'S KUNZEA**

1-2 2m x 1-2m. It is a fast growing shrub with brilliant short red bottle-brush flowers. Tolerates moderately red situations. Ornamental. Minimum rainfall 600mm. Soils F.G.

**Kunzea parvifolia - VIOLET KUNZEA**

2m x 3m. A spreading shrub from the Grampians with fine aromatic leaves and masses of violet flowers in Spring and early Summer. Likes moist well drained soils and tolerates frost.

## **KENNEDIAS**

**Kennedia coccinea - CORAL VINE**

Vigorous climber with red pea shaped flowers with a yellow eye in Spring. Likes a well-drained soil, will handle some frost.

**Kennedia nigricans - BLACK CORAL PEA**

As with Kennidea coccinea, but with a black flower with a red blotch. Vigorous.

**Kennedia prostrata - RUNNING POSTMAN**

Native evergreen ground creeper which will spread to 1-5m. Scarlet pea shaped flowers appear in spring and early summer. Tolerates lime and drought. Usually frost resistant. Good hanging basket plant. The leaves were used by early settlers to make a pleasant tasting beverage.

**Kennedia rubicunda - DUSTY CORAL PEA**

An evergreen vine, which climbs to a height of 3m. Vigorous grower, with dark red pea shaped flowers appearing in spring. Tolerates lime, coastal exposure and drought. Usually frost resistant.



## LEPTOSPERMUMS (TEA TREES)

### Leptospermum continentale - PRICKLY TEA TREE

1.6. x 6-4 m. A shrub that likes full or part sun. Tolerates lime, drought and moderate frost. 1.5cm white open petal in spring/summer. Quick growing and useful for hedges, windbreaks and screens. Great for attracting birds.

### Leptospermum flavescens - TANTOON TEA TREE

Rounded shrub to 3m x 2m. Light green oblong leaves. Profuse white flowers in late spring and summer. Moist well drained soils. Tolerates, smog and drought. Usually frost resistant.

### Leptospermum lanigerum - WOOLY TEA TREE

2-5m x 1-3m. Hardy shrub, massed with white flowers during spring. Prefers moist, well drained soils. Will grow well in full or filtered sun. Attracts butterflies and seed eating birds. Tolerates light snow, drought, smog and frost.

### Leptospermum petersonii - LEMON SCENTED TEA-TREE

5m x 6m. Small white flowers in the Summer. Leaves emit a lemon scent when crushed. Soils F.G.

### Leptospermum rotundifolium - ROUNDEAF TEA-TREE

3m x 1m. A very hardy garden shrub with large pink flowers. Minimum rainfall 500mm. Soils F.G.

### Leptospermum scoparium - MANUKA

2m x 2m. This very attractive shrub is found in the Grampians and the Otways. Minimum rainfall 600mm. Soils F.G.

## MELALEUCAS

### Melaleuca acuminata - CREAMY HONEY MYRTLE

2m x 2m. Medium to tall shrub with small pointed leaves, white flowers clustered along stems in early summer to late spring. Prefers well-drained soil. Tolerates dryness and lime. Usually frost resistant.

### Melaleuca armillaris - BRACELET HONEY-MYRTLE

5m. A small compact tree or large shrub with drooping bracelets and white flowers. Useful for low shelter and hedges. Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils A.B.D.E.F.G.

### Melaleuca decussata - CROSS LEAFED HONEY-MYRTLE

3-5m x 3-5m. This very tough shrub likes poorly drained sites. It has small mauve flower spikes from Oct. - Feb. Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils - most types.

### Melaleuca ericifolia - SWAMP PAPERBARK

4-5m x 3m. Hardy, fast growing tree. Masses of creamy white bottlebrush like flowers in spring and summer. Attracts nectar-eating birds. Tolerates lime, salt, smog and frost. Good coastal plant. Prefers moist, well-drained soil.



**Melaleuca fulgens - SCARLET HONEY MYRTLE**

1.5m x 1.5m. Medium shrub with narrow leaves and large showy mauve bottlebrush-like flowers in spring. Prefers well-drained soil. Usually frost resistant.

**Melaleuca halmaturorum - KANGAROO PAPERBARK**

5m x 4m. This tree is very suitable to the Wimmera Mallee. The short brushes have white flowers from Oct. - Dec. and serves as a very handy windbreak.

Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils C.D.E.F.G.

**Melaleuca hypericifolia - HILLOCK BUSH**

2-3m x 2-3m. A dense shrub with olive green leaves with attractive reddish new growth and dull red flowers from July to Jan. Responds to pruning; makes a good hedge. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils A.D.E.F.G.

**Melaleuca incana - GREY HONEY MYRTLE**

2.5m x 2m. Tall shrub with soft grey-green leaves. Yellowish-green leaves in spring. Will grow in most soils. Tolerates some wetness, dryness, lime and smog. Usually frost resistant.

**Melaleuca lanceolata - MOONAH or BLACK TEA TREE**

6m x 3m. Small tree with deep green or grey-green leaves, white flowers in early spring and summer. Will grow in any soil, tolerating wetness, drought, coastal exposure, lime, salt soil and smog. Usually frost resistant.

**Melaleuca laterita - ROBIN RED BREAST BUSH**

2.5m x 1m. Medium shrub with narrow leaves, bright orange-red bottlebrush like flowers. Grows in any soil, tolerating wetness, dryness, lime and smog. Usually frost resistant.

**Melaleuca linariifolia - SNOW IN SUMMER**

10m x 4m. Shapely bushy tree with attractive foliage and lovely paper-bark trunk. Flowers in early summer with a dense mantle of white flowers. Drought and frost resistant.

**Melaleuca neglecta - MALLEE HONEY-MYRTLE**

2m x 2m. An erect shrub with small clusters of cream flowers along last year's branches. Hardy and salt tolerant. Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils C.D.E.F.G.

**Melaleuca nesophila - SHOWY HONEY-MYRTLE**

2-3m. This excellent foliage plant has spikes of creamy coloured flowers from Sept. to Nov. Minimum rainfall 450mm. Soils A.D.E.F.G.

**Melaleuca pentagona LITTLE PENTA**

2m x 2.5m. Medium to tall shrub with needle like leaves and heads of bright pink flowers in spring. Drought and frost resistant. Prefers well-drained soils.

**Melaleuca pulchella - CLAW FLOWER**

1.2m x 1.5m. Small shrub with small leaves and rich pink claw flowers in spring and summer. Likes well drained soil, tolerating some wetness, dryness and lime. Usually frost resistant.



**Melaleuca radula - GRACEFUL HONEY MYRTLE**

2.5m x 1.5m. Strong growing shrub with pink/mauve gold tipped flowers on arching branches. Drought and frost hardy. Suitable for windbreaks.

**Melaleuca squarrosa - SCENTED PAPERBARK**

3-5m x 2m. Tall bushy shrub with good foliage and yellow brush flowers in Spring and Summer. Handles moist soils, but prefers wet sites. Tolerates lime, salt and frost. Minimum rainfall 650mm.

**Melaleuca stypheloides - PRICKLY PAPERBARK**

10m x 3m. Medium to tall tree with a mottled paperbark trunk, small pointed green leaves and a mass of cream flowers in summer. Will generally grow in any soil, tolerating wetness, dryness, lime, salt, smog and frost.

**Melaleuca thymifolia - THYME HONEY MYRTLE**

1m x 80cm. A hardy compact shrub with mauve claw flowers in spring and summer, which attract nectar eating birds and butterflies. Grows well in most soil types in full or filtered sun. Tolerates wetness, dryness, lime, smog. Usually frost resistant.

**Melaleuca violacea - VIOLET HONEY-MYRTLE**

Small to medium shrub, small attractive leaves and violet flowers in Spring. Most soils. Tolerates wetness, dryness, lime and some frost.

**Melaleuca wilsonii - CRIMSON HONEY-MYRTLE**

2m x 2-3m. A spreading low shrub with small, pointed leaves and bright purple-violet flowers born on slender branches. It is tolerant of reasonably moist of dry conditions. Minimum rainfall 400mm. Soils - most types.
